

**SUMMARY of the Decision of the Inquiries, Complaints and Reports Committee

INTRODUCTION

The Respondent carried out one virtual psychiatric consultation with the Patient. The Patient's condition continued to worsen leading to hospitalization.

COMMITTEE'S DECISION

The Committee considered this matter at its meeting of May 4, 2026.

The Committee required the Respondent to appear before a Panel of the Committee to be cautioned regarding his repeated failure to keep complete and comprehensive documentation and maintain professional communication.

The Committee also accepted an undertaking from the Respondent.

COMMITTEE'S ANALYSIS

The Committee was of the view that the Respondent's consultation note was inadequate and lacking key clinical information, including patient identification, medication history, diagnosis and a clear treatment plan. The documentation did not address how the new medication was to be introduced or whether existing medication was to be continued or stopped (potentially causing severe withdrawal symptoms). The complaint also included concerns about the Respondent's professionalism and communication. The Committee was concerned that, in his response, the Respondent did not demonstrate insight into his deficiencies or his communication style.

The Committee noted that similar concerns had been raised previously and was troubled that they have recurred despite prior remediation. As a result, the Committee considered the current concerns to reflect an ongoing pattern in the Respondent's practice, rather than an isolated incident.

CONCLUSION

Therefore, in addition to accepting the Respondent's undertaking, the Committee required the Respondent to appear before a Panel of the Committee to be cautioned as outlined above.

This is a summary of the Committee's decision as it relates to the caution disposition.
