

**SUMMARY of the Decision of the Inquiries, Complaints and Reports Committee

Dr. Haider Hasnain (CPSO #64959)

INTRODUCTION

In May 2017, Dr. Hasnain entered an undertaking with the College. While he completed some elements of the undertaking in a reasonable and timely manner, some elements were not completed in a timely or adequate manner. Subsequently, the Committee approved the Registrar's appointment of investigators to conduct a broad review of Dr. Hasnain's practice.

Dr. Hasnain's certificate of registration was suspended on January 17, 2019 by the Discipline Committee pending a penalty hearing for a different matter. His certificate of registration was ultimately revoked at the penalty hearing.

COMMITTEE'S DECISION

A Family Practice Panel of the Committee considered this matter at its meeting of October 3, 2019. The Committee required Dr. Hasnain to attend at the College to be cautioned in person with respect to his compliance with his undertaking.

COMMITTEE'S ANALYSIS

- The Committee noted that Dr. Hasnain's compliance with the educational aspects of his undertaking required several attempts by the College to obtain confirmation that he had completed the required work.
- Further, a second aspect of the undertaking was supervision. During the supervision period, Dr. Hasnain's supervisor identified problems, including concerns with Dr. Hasnain's charting, a lack of new narcotic patient charts to review, and (on his second report) that some of the charting was worse than the original charts provided. The supervisor also noted that he was not being provided with the necessary records in a timely manner. Furthermore, when the supervisor formally resigned, he outlined the consistent issues he had with Dr. Hasnain's clinical practice and delays in receiving charts to review.
- The Committee was concerned about Dr. Hasnain's repeated difficulties in complying with his undertaking. While Dr. Hasnain's certificate was revoked by the Discipline Committee, the Committee noted that he may reapply in five years to the College. At that time, it would be necessary for him to complete his undertaking with the College. Given Dr. Hasnain's difficulty with compliance in the past, the Committee continued to

have concerns with regards to whether he would fulfill the requirements of the undertaking if he is ever reinstated at the College. As a result, the Committee was of the view that it would be appropriate to caution the Respondent in person with respect to his compliance with his undertaking.
